RESOLUTION OF TOWN BOARD PROPOSING TO EXCEED THE LEVY LIMIT

Resolution No. 2022-04

State of Wisconsin Town of Plymouth Rock County

Whereas, the State of Wisconsin has imposed levy limits on town, village, city, and county levies for 2022 and thereafter under 66.0602, Wis Stat.;

Whereas, s. 66.0602, Wis Stat. limits the allowable local levy for 2022 to a percentage increase of no more than the greater of:

- a. Zero percent of the 2021 payable 2022 adjusted actual levy as calculated under the state's levy limit law or
- b. A percentage equal to the percent change in equalized value due to net new construction less improvements removed with for the town of Plymouth is **0.889%**.

Whereas, the town board of the Town of Plymouth, Rock County, believes that for the 2022 tax levy (to be collected in 2023) it is in the town's best interest to exceed the state levy limit as described above by a greater percentage than 0.889%.

Whereas, the Town of Plymouth 2021 payable 2022 adjusted actual tax levy was \$169,195 and further whereas the state law would limit this year's increase to \$1,504 (\$169,195 x .889%), for a total allowable town tax levy of \$170,045 (\$170,699 less \$654.41 for the 2022 personal property aid payment) before adjustments for 2022 (to be collected in 2023);

THEREFORE, the town board of the Town of Plymouth, Rock County, Wisconsin, does hereby resolve and orders as follows:

- 1. The town board supports an increase in the town tax levy for 2022 that will exceed the amount allowed by the state levy limit.
- 2. The town board directs that the question of increasing the allowable town tax levy for 2022 (to be collected in 2023) by **147.02**% (\$250,000÷ \$170,045 which would increase the town levy by **\$250,000** for a total town tax levy (after adjustments) of \$420,045 (\$170,045 + \$250,000) shall be placed on the agenda for the special town meeting to be held on November 15, 2022
